Becoming a Volunteer

Volunteer application forms are available at our office location. Forms may also be completed online at www.mcleodalliance.org under the "Volunteer" tab.

All applicants must be willing to undergo local and state criminal background checks. Costs of screening are covered by McLeod Alliance.

Successful applicants will be interviewed by the volunteer coordinator to determine the best fit for volunteer activities, given the applicant's interests. We believe that volunteering should be enjoyable, so we encourage volunteers to get to know our agency, closely examine our mission, and decide what volunteer activities they wish to do.

Once approved for volunteer service, training will be provided to better understand McLeod Alliance, our mission, services, and policies.
